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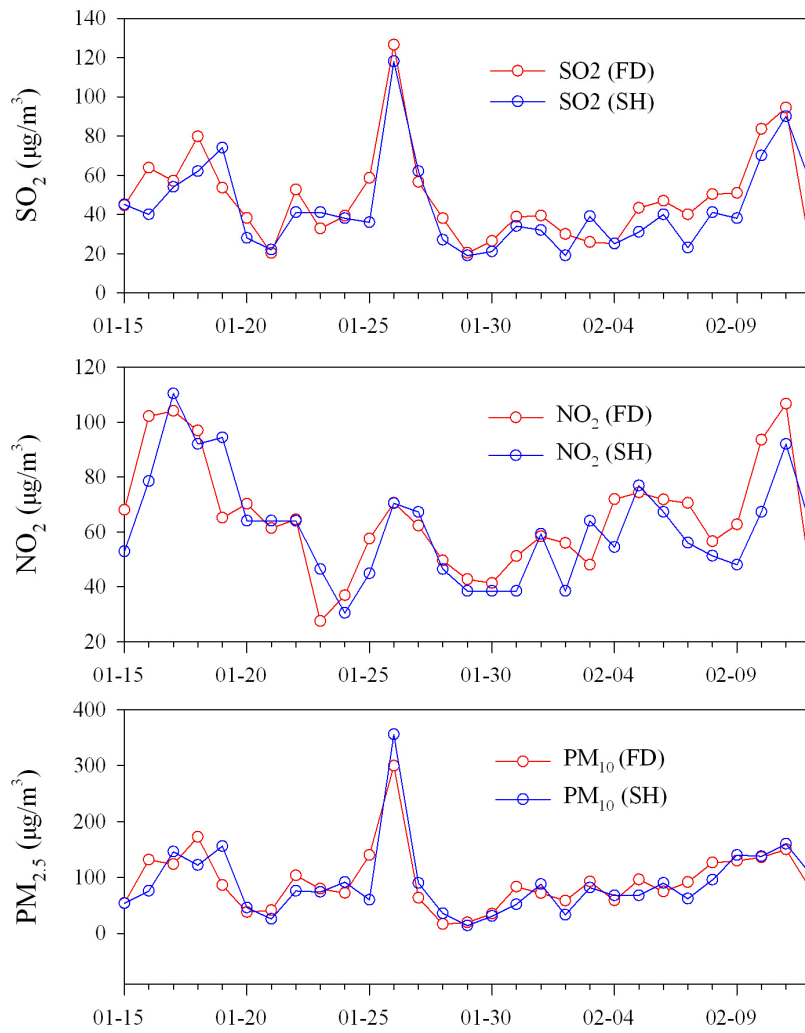

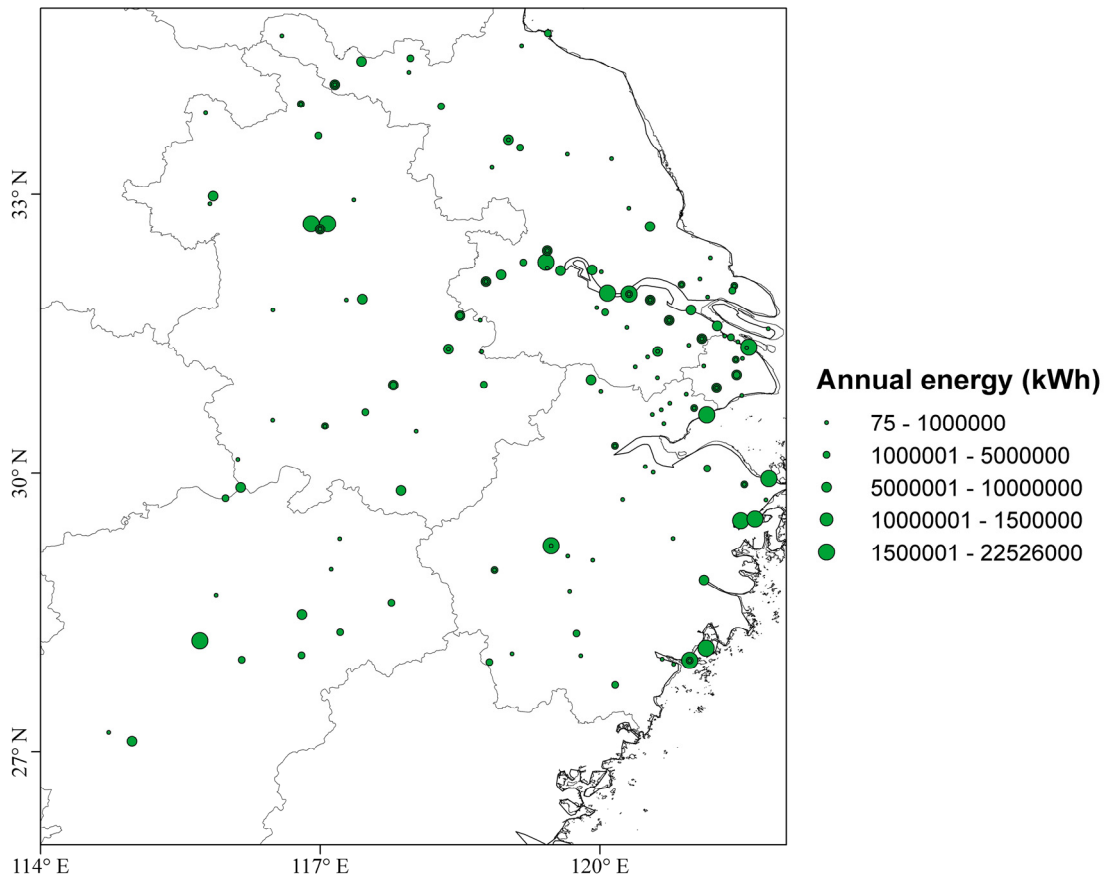


Fig. S2. Distribution of power plants (green dots) with annual energy (kWh) over YRD in 2009 (Source: CARMA).
