

Interactive comment on “Glassy aerosols with a range of compositions nucleate ice heterogeneously at cirrus temperatures” by T. W. Wilson et al.

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In 2-nd paragraph of Introduction, the authors reviewed previous works which dealt with enhanced relative humidity with respect to ice observed outside and inside upper tropospheric cirrus ice clouds. The authors did not reference the following two works which also dealt with upper tropospheric cirrus ice clouds.
